SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDATIONS

Recommendations Affecting Accreditation

1. The Landscape Architecture program should engage in long-range planning to re-establish clear program direction, goals and objectives. A fully articulated strategic plan should follow, complete with metrics and assessment techniques for progress toward the outcomes (Standard 1).
